

Uniform

Please ensure all uniform is clearly labelled and that PE kits are always kept in school. This will help to ensure all pupils are prepared for their weekly PE sessions and that any misplaced uniform can easily be found.

Our preloved uniform is available, and we have samples in the school entrance hall. Please ensure you cover over any existing names on preloved uniform and replace them with your child's name. This will help staff identify the owners of missing items.

Gentle reminders

Nail varnish is not to be worn in school and all earrings must be a simple stud which can be removed in PE lessons or covered with tape.

Smart watches which track steps are permitted but any smart watch with the ability to take a photograph or play games are not to be worn in school following our safeguarding protocol.

Mobile phones must be switched off and handed into the class teacher on arrival to school where they can be kept safe and handed back out at home time. We would only expect pupils in Year 6 who walk or cycle home independently to need to have a mobile or any children who are being collected by a different parent. Staff will ensure mobiles are stored away safely during the school day in line with our safeguarding protocol.

Attendance Matters

School tries to make sure that all our children attend every day. However, we cannot do this alone and need your help as parents to ensure your child has the best possible attendance they can have. Please note that I am unable to authorise absences for holidays taken outside of school holiday dates and fines will be administered for holidays of 5 or more consecutive days.

Statutory update

Please note that the school gate opens at 8:45am. This gives a 15minute window until the register is closed and late marks allocated. From 9:15am the school registers will be marked as an unauthorised absence.

Please endeavour to be on time to school each day. If you need any support please contact the school office or speak to me.

Staff will close the gate promptly as we will be having daily collective worship at 9am in the school hall.

Wrap around care

We are pleased to announce that we have purchased a school mobile for our wrap around care. Miss King will continue to run our daily breakfast club from 7:45am and Miss King alongside Florrie will run our after school care from 3:15- 4:45pm, and Jane will then cover the last period of time from 4:45-6pm.

Please note that you will need to book your children into breakfast club if you will need to drop them off prior to the gate opening at 8:45am. Any children seen to be left will be taken into school and placed in breakfast club and parents will be charged. This is due to safeguarding and ensuring pupils are not at risk.

Parents of Year 6 pupils are able to let school know via letter/email if they give permission for their child to walk or cycle to school alone.

It is wonderful to see our numbers growing for wrap around care and this is why Miss King will have Florrie helping her each day.
