the morning with collective worship at 9am in the school hall.

Pupils arriving after 9am will be marked as late and from 9:30 the registers will be marked as an unauthorised absence.

Collective Worship

As we step into the New Year, we have lots of things to look forward to in school. Our daily collective worships will initially focus **on 'Turning over a new leaf'**, starting afresh and setting new personal challenges.

The Bible offers many verses that inspire new beginnings and personal growth.

These verses speak to the heart of what it means to start afresh, guided by faith, hope and love – our core school values.

A huge thank you to our FOTS for organising such a fabulous variety of fundraising events during Autumn term including: Autumn Lights Trail, Elf dash, wreath making, Christmas raffle and the Christmas fair.

FOTS will update us all soon on the total monies raised but just the Christmas fair alone raised £1200. It is a staggering amount for such a small village school to have raised so thank you to each and every one of you who supported these events and a huge thank you to Emma and her FOTS team for their expertise and for volunteering their time to organise and hold these events, all of which raise funds for the children in school now. We are very grateful to you all.

This year funds raised by FOTS will be supporting our pupil attending our enrichment activities such as the B Tales performances, the trip to



the pantomime and in supporting the cost of transport, as well as equipment and updating resources in school, which our school budget cannot stretch to.

Our newest project has been the creation of a history timeline which is located outside on the playground wall so pupils can see it during breaks and lunchtimes. It includes local history such as: Great Budworth School, St Mary and All Saints Church – Great Budworth, Anderton boat lift and the Lion Salt works at Marston. The timeline is a great way to develop a sense of chronology and for the children to understand the historical periods, Kings and Queens and events that shaped Britain and the World today.

Please keep your eyes out for the next FOTS events for the spring term, which we will be informing you of in the coming weeks.

<u>Uniform</u>

Please ensure all uniform is clearly labelled and that PE kits are to be worn on PE days: Tuesday and Friday. This will help to ensure all pupils are prepared for their weekly PE sessions and that any misplaced uniform can easily be found.

A reminder that School PE kit/ uniform is: white tee shirt, Navy blue shorts/ joggers/ leggings, trainers worn with school sweatshirt or cardigan. No football kit is to be worn.

Our preloved uniform is available, and we have samples in the school entrance hall. Please ensure you cover over any existing names on preloved uniform and replace them with your child's name. This will help staff identify the owners of missing items.

Gentle Reminders

Nail varnish is not to be worn in school and all earrings must be a simple stud which can be removed in PE lessons or covered with tape.

Smart watches which track steps are permitted but any smart watch with the ability to take a photograph or play games are not to be worn in school following our safeguarding protocol.

We do not encourage children to have mobile phones in school however, on occasions, we would only expect pupils in Year 6 who walk or cycle home independently to need to have a mobile or any children who are being collected by a different parent. Mobile phones must be switched off and handed into the class teacher on arrival to school where they can be kept safe and handed back out at home time. Staff will ensure mobiles are stored away safely during the school day again, falling in with our safeguarding protocol.
